Chase Oliver is a 38-year-old Libertarian activist living in Atlanta. Dubbed "...the most influential Libertarian in America..." by Rolling Stone, Oliver is a champion of the rights of the individual against the growing power of the state.

Oliver began his political activism opposing the War in Iraq under then-President George W. Bush, and he discovered the Libertarian Party when he stopped by a booth at the Atlanta Pride Festival in 2010.

In 2020, he ran for Congress in Georgia's 5th district to complete the term of the late civil rights icon John Lewis. In 2022, he ran for U.S. Senate, debating incumbent Sen. Raphael Warnock and Herschel Walker's empty podium. Oliver was widely credited with causing the runoff election between Warnock and Walker.

Oliver advocates the adoption of Ranked Choice Voting to avoid future runoffs. Riding the success of his senate campaign, Oliver announced his presidential exploratory committee in December 2022. Since then, he has been traveling across the country to connect with voters and other libertarians.

Chase Oliver has appeared on PBS, CNN, Fox Business, CSPAN, WSB TV and Radio, Fox 5, 11 Alive News, Vice Media, Reason TV. He has been featured in the The New York Times, The Washington Post, Bloomberg, The Atlanta Journal-Constitution, The Guardian, and Rolling Stone.
